

Travelling Vine Scarf

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Noro yarn is knit into a skinny scarf with a sweet travelling vine pattern. The green in this yarn inspired the stitch I chose, but I am sure it would look equally pretty with any Noro colours!

Difficulty: Medium

Yarn: Noro Kuyeron (50g, 109 yards)

Amount Needed: 2 skeins

Needles: 4.5mm, 7US

Gauge: N/A

Notions: Yarn needle, scissors

Directions: Cast on 20 sts and work in seed stitch for 3 rows. Keeping first and last two stitches of each row in seed stitch (these stitches have not been included in the pattern below), work in following pattern:

Row 1: *yo, k1tbl, yo, ssk, k5. Rep from *

Row 2: p4, *p2tog tbl, p7. Rep from *, end last rep p3

Row 3: *yo, k1 tbl, yo, k2, ssk, k3. Rep from *

Row 4: p2, *p2tog tbl, p7. Rep from *, end last rep p5

Row 5: *k1 tbl, yo, k4, ssk, k1, yo. Rep from *

Row 6: p1, *p2tog tbl, p7. Rep from *, end last rep p6

Row 7: *k5, k2tog, yo, k1 tbl, yo. Rep from *

Row 8: p3, *p2tog, p7. Rep from *, end last rep p4

Row 9: *k3, k2tog, k2, yo, k1 tbl, yo. Rep from *

Row 10: *p5, p2tog, p2. Rep from *

Row 11: *yo, k1, k2tog, k4, yo, k1 tbl. Rep from *

Row 12: *p6, p2tog, p1. Rep from *

Work last three rows in seed stitch. Cast off loosely. Weave in ends. Scarf needs to be wet blocked in order for lace pattern to lay flat. Enjoy your beautiful scarf!

Abbreviations and Techniques Used:

* – signals a repeat start or stop

k – knit, if followed by a number knit that many stitches

k2tog – knit two stitches together

p – purl, if followed by a number purl that many stitches

p2tog – purl two stitches together

rep – repeat

ssk – slip, slip, knit

sts - stitches

tbl – through back loop

yo – yarn over
